Minute 10207

To consider Planning Matters in the parish

Cllr Hussey reported that Buckinghamshire Council no longer show comments from residents on planning applications to the public and therefore proposed asking anyone who submits a comment to send a copy to the Clerk so that the Parish Council are aware. All in agreement to place the request in the Hambleden Valley magazine, the Frieth Village Society newsletter, the PC Facebook page, and website. He also circulated an updated Parish Council Planning Policy Statement considering changes to the principal authority, the rebranding to the National Landscape from the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and updating of links. All in agreement for the updated changes.

Minute 10208

To consider replacing the broken bollards at Mill End to stop cars parking on the grass; to discuss a request for the speed limit to be reduced here

All in agreement to replace, Clerk to source quotations for both wooden and metal posts. With regards to a reduction in speed limit, new signage is more likely as Buckinghamshire Council do not support reducing to 20mph. Clerk will carry out a review of the current signage there.

To receive an update regarding the Kenricks mausoleum in Hambleden churchyard

Cllr Webb reported that a report was carried out in 2008, and at that time it would cost £80-100,000 to restore. The new fencing was installed recently for health and safety purposes, following the Diocese quinquennial report.

Minute 10210

To consider the benches in Frieth following an audit by Frieth Village Society and the request for the Parish Council to take ownership of some and pay for the refurbishment of others

Cllr House prior to the meeting had circulated a paper. All in agreement to not take responsibility for any benches that were not originally purchased or installed by the Parish Council and are agreeable to replace the broken bench at the crossroads, in conjunction with FVS if they still wish.

Minute 10211

To receive an update regarding Pheasants Hill Common and the continued research into obtaining ownership

Cllr Hussey reported that following an online meeting with Lawyers for Nature, they confirmed that the only route would be to apply for setting up a Commons Council, although this is meant for much larger areas than the common. It is a long process to do, including consultations and an application to the Secretary of State. Lawyers for Nature will investigate what the chances of being successful are, but he does not think this is a good way to proceed. An alternative is that Lawyers for Nature are investigating giving nature its own voice, and the potential to give land its own rights. They are drawing up test cases and asked if the Common could be included, all in agreement. A full report will follow which will be circulated to Councillors when available.
